History



In 1641, Queen Christina granted the settlement town privileges, envisioning it as a central hub for the mining industry in the Bergslagen region. For centuries, the area thrived on the extraction of silver and iron, and the village became a vital meeting point for miners, traders, and travelers. It was during this time that the famous Grythyttans Gästgivaregård was established. Inns were built at regular intervals along Swedish roads to ensure that travelers and their horses had a place to rest. As the mining industry eventually declined in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, many small industrial towns faced an uncertain future. Grythyttan was no exception, and for a period, its historic wooden buildings fell into quiet neglect. However, the village underwent a dramatic "renaissance" in the 1970s, and Grythyttan was reimagined as a center for gastronomy and hospitality.

Discover Grythyttan

Måltidens Hus

Måltidens Hus (The House of Meals) was originally built as the Swedish Pavilion for the 1992 World Expo in Seville. The building was later on transported to Grythyttan in 1993, where it now stands as a culinary university, and in addition happen to have the very first cookbook museum in the Nordics.

Loka Brunn

Loka Brunn has been a place of restoration for centuries. Their restaurant focuses on "the flavors of the forest," serving elegant dishes inspired by the surrounding Bergslagen nature.



Cornelis

This vibrant bistro and pub offers a more relaxed, atmosphere with hearty food and frequent live music. It's the ideal place to enjoy a cold drink and a good meal while soaking in the local music history.

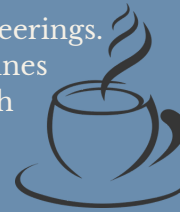
Swedish Fika
